### A GIANT LEHP FOR MANY KIDS

The invaluable LEHP (Lions Eye Health Program) testing has been a feature of activities at Dromana P.S. and Red Hill Consolidated School for several years now and this year was no exception. We always choose to test Gr 1 students because at this age, students are starting to develop reading and numeracy skills and eye problems could slow their progress.

Over two days, (5 & 6 March 2025) members of Dromana L.C., Red Hill L.C. and Rye L.C. conducted the testing under the expert guidance of Rod Jackson. Zone Chair Julie Swan also helped out on the day.

We always invite neighbouring clubs to take part because when member numbers are small, it is often difficult for one club to run the whole program. So pooling resources and skills is a good solution, plus it has the benefit of meeting Lions from other clubs and having a chat over coffee.

Both days started with a refresher course provided by Rod and it gave the new recruits the opportunity to ask questions. Whilst the online training is very good, it is always reassuring to clarify procedural matters with Rod.

At the end of each session results were conveyed to the parents on the standard reporting form, as supplied by the program website. Whilst most children breezed through the four tests, this year a number of children had difficulty with the colour-blindness test and one student failed all tests. In this case Rod printed off the complete set of results, as provided by the 'camera', so that a future visit to an optometrist would enable the professional to quickly concentrate on the problem areas needing attention.

Sincere thanks go to all Lions who took part and especially to Rod Jackson for devoting so much of his time to this important program. Congratulations to everyone on a job well done!

#### **GREEN CANOPY NEWS**

It's great to see the number of clubs that have their own Green Canopy projects up and running. If you are looking to get involved, keep in mind that you can look at completing an individual project or your club may choose to work on a joint project with other clubs in your area. Perhaps your zone as a group, or even your District as a whole may set goals and challenges for each of these areas to attain. From the number of questions received and discussion on the Green Canopy Project, my committee sees a bright future for this program.

For the project's success we do require clubs to keep up the good work and continue to report their efforts on the portal. We also need clubs to send us photos of these projects so we can keep our web page up to date and share with everyone what we all are doing. All that is needed is to simply send them to greencanopy@lions.org.au – you may even see yourself in our next newsletter! We all must remember that our goal is to plant one million trees by June 30th, 2027. Several people have voiced concern that while they can get their share of trees planted, the manpower may not be available to satisfactorily service the needs of the plants as they grow and some may be lost. I cannot emphasise enough, that our purpose with this project is to plant 1 million trees. In an ideal world we would have a team available to support each and every tree through to adulthood. However, in the real world this is not always possible therefore we will have losses to varying degrees which we must cope with.

Planting trees gives us the opportunity for fresh lush growth. Not planting trees gives us and our environment nothing, so that the ongoing loss of trees continues. We know growing any plant or plants has its challenges - nature continues to hamper our best efforts. Unpredictable floods, drought, fire, wind and pests will always be there to challenge us. We ask you all to join us in opposing these forces of nature and for us to achieve our aim of planting one million trees by 30th June 2027. The more we plant, the more that survive!!

Being seen to plant trees will also involve the community – communities may even want to take responsibility for nurturing what we plant. What a great way to involve them! The more we are seen as a green organisation, supporting the environment, the more we will be relevant to our communities - particularly younger people. The potential to grow our organisation through this project should be front of mind at all times.
