FLINDERS MOTORING HERITAGE EVENT

The Lions Club of Flinders District hosts its annual Flinders Motoring Heritage Event on Easter Sunday. In 2026, the event will celebrate its 10th year. For more details, visit www.flindersdistrictlions.com.au and navigate to the Flinders Motoring Heritage page.

Historically, the event raises funds for a specific cause and often attracts an Australian Lions Foundation (ALF) grant. Recent beneficiaries include Southern Peninsula Community Support, where funds supported a mobile shower, toilet, and laundry van for those experiencing homelessness on the southern Mornington Peninsula, followed by a vehicle to tow it.

In 2024, funds were raised to refurbish interactive garden spaces at Peninsula Health's Mornington Centre, a specialist facility aiding patients with dementia and cognitive issues in recovering from medical procedures before returning home.

This year, the event supported the purchase of a replacement prostate scanning machine at Peninsula Health's Frankston Hospital. Together with an ALF grant, the club contributed \$40,000, ensuring the project was fully funded.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S REPORT

Greetings, Lions of District 201V3,

The year is moving quickly, and we already have the first quarter behind us. By now, you should have registered for the upcoming District Conference, to be held at Lardner Park near Warragul from Friday, October 24 to Sunday, October 26, 2025. The conference will feature an engaging lineup of guest speakers and a full business program with important motions to be debated. To ensure your club's voice is heard, please confirm that your club has appointed delegates and that their names have been sent to Cabinet Secretary Terry.

Now, let's discuss succession planning. Is it too early to think about who will lead your club in 2026/27? No—in fact, in just three months, you will need to seek nominations for key positions: President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Membership Chair, as well as other roles your club may wish to fill. During those three months, we have Christmas and January, a period when many clubs go into recess. It's time to start thinking about these positions now. Last year, otherwise healthy clubs faced closure because they couldn't find members to fill key roles.

The President's role is to lead the club and address issues as they arise. It is a responsible and important position but not overly demanding.

The hardest worker among the executive is the Secretary, and the most challenging task for a Secretary is finding a successor when their term ends. Too often, no member steps forward, leaving the long-serving Secretary to continue for another year. But it doesn't have to be that hard. Break the Secretary's role into three parts: agenda and minute taking, correspondence, and reporting. If clubs allocate these tasks to three people—a Secretary and two Assistant Secretaries—the workload is shared, and each Assistant Secretary can be a "Secretary in Training." It's not rocket science!

The Treasurer's role can be as simple or complex as the person holding it desires. Many boutique accounting programs exist, but for medium to small clubs, a simple Excel spreadsheet will usually suffice. Month by month, the Treasurer must report straightforward spreadsheets for all club bank accounts, showing start and end-of-month balances and details of income and expenditure. Financial reporting must be accurate, transparent, and available for all members to view. Again—not rocket science!

We are fast approaching the District Conference, Friday, October 24 to Sunday, October 26, 2025. Don't forget to register and ensure your club's delegates are registered. Each club in good financial standing is entitled to one delegate for every ten members. The conference will be held at Lardner Park, 155 Burnt Store Road, Lardner (12 kilometers from Warragul) for your GPS. The Dinner Dance will take place at the Warragul Country Club, 41 Sutton Street, Warragul. I look forward to seeing many of you there.

I continue to enjoy working with the clubs and Lions of District 201V3 and am well into club visits, a role I cherish. Let's continue to have a great year, serving better together.

To date, I have received three Peace Posters in preparation for judging at our District V3 Convention on Saturday afternoon, October 25, 2025. Clubs participating should have collected, or should now collect, Posters and/or Peace Essays from their schools for judging at the club level. As previously mentioned, for every kit purchased, you may nominate one winning poster to advance to the District final.

Posters can be sent via Australia Post in a cylinder to 427 Lower Franklin Road, Foster 3960, to be received no later than Wednesday, October 21, 2025. (I cannot receive posters by mail after this date.) Alternatively, please attend the Convention and deliver your poster(s) by noon on Saturday, October 25, 2025.

District Governor Geoff is providing a \$100.00 prize for the winning poster and two \$50.00 vouchers for runners-up. Three judges will evaluate the posters based on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme.

As a reminder, youth who are 11, 12, or 13 years old by November 15 are eligible to participate. Artwork must be no smaller than 33 centimeters by 50 centimeters and no larger than 50 centimeters by 60 centimeters. A2 paper meets these criteria.

I have emailed a writable proforma certificate that can be given to all students who enter the contest. This certificate recognizes all entrants to help boost each student's self-esteem.


WARRAGUL BIRTHDAY MILESTONES


